Message from our Chairperson

The IVL Foundation has been dedicated to enhancing lives since 2018. Over the years, our initiatives have expanded to support numerous underprivileged groups. Recently, we identified a critical shortage of essential medical equipment at one of the nation's largest correctional facilities, the Central Women's Correctional Institution in Bangkok. The facility lacked Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs), hospital beds, wheelchairs, stretchers, and walkers. After discussions with prison officers, the Foundation successfully procured and delivered the necessary equipment to the prison. This effort aims to promote both the physical and mental well-being of female inmates, as well as to aid in their rehabilitation and improve their quality of life. Additionally, we provided training on the use of the defibrillators to the prison staff.

One of our most cherished projects is Operation Smile Thailand, which performs surgeries for children with cleft lips or palates and offers plastic surgery for burn victims. The impact of these surgeries is profound, as children can smile for the first time. This year, for the first time, doctors and nurses traveled to Pattani in southern Thailand to operate on children with cleft lips and palates. As a result, forty children benefited and can now eat and drink normally.

Our Rural Development Project is unique as it is a long-term initiative aimed at improving various aspects of student life at Bannurnpayom School and its sub-branch in Bueng Nakhon, Hua Hin. We began by installing solar panels and batteries to ensure a stable power supply throughout the day, enabling the use of computers for the first time. We also renovated a dilapidated room to create a children's library, fostering a lifelong love of reading. As part of our Satellite Consolidation Strategy (SCS), we are integrating knowledge from other projects to enhance the schools and their students, including the introduction of potable water and small agricultural projects.

We continue to provide water filtration equipment to schools and communities nationwide, ensuring access to clean water. Furthermore, we have awarded scholarships to students at all educational levels, including nursing students.

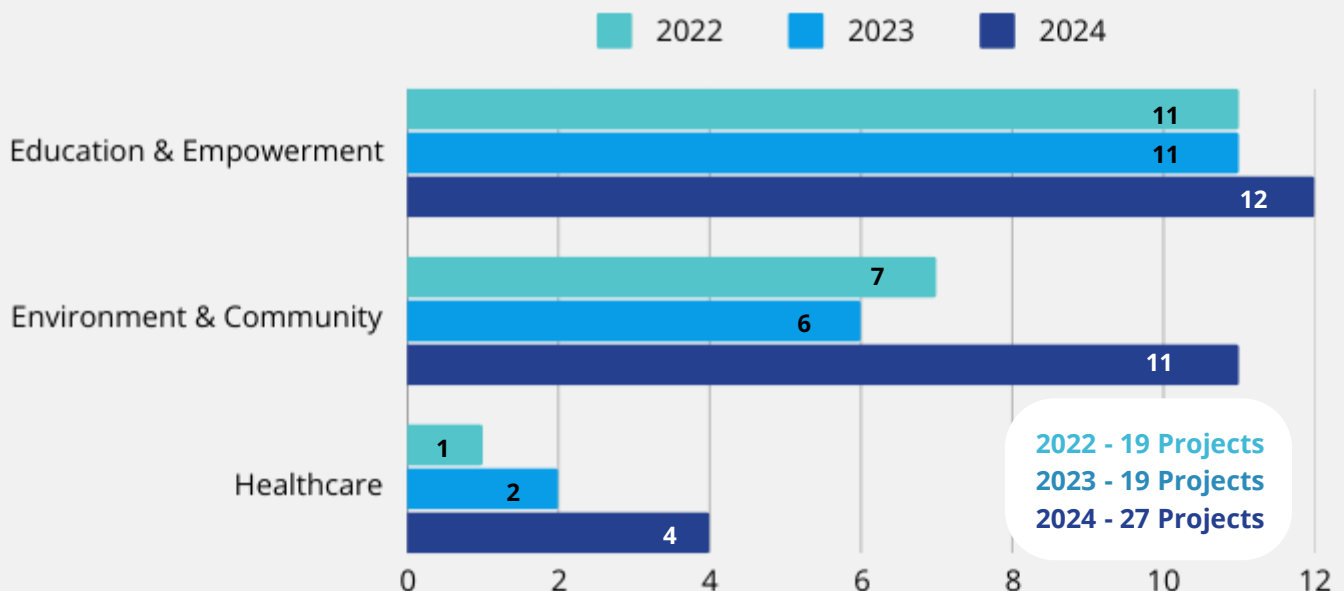


The Year in Review

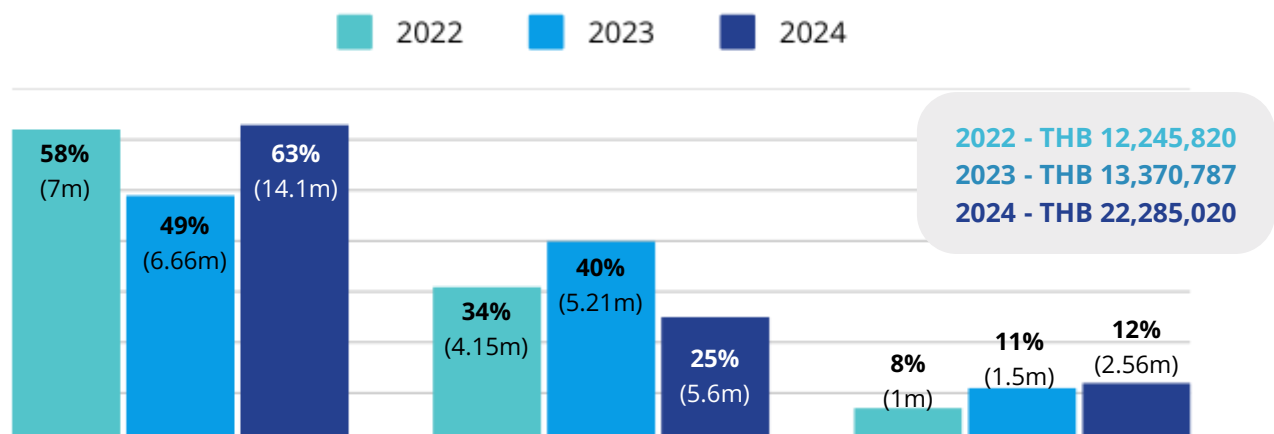

Number of Projects in 2022-2024

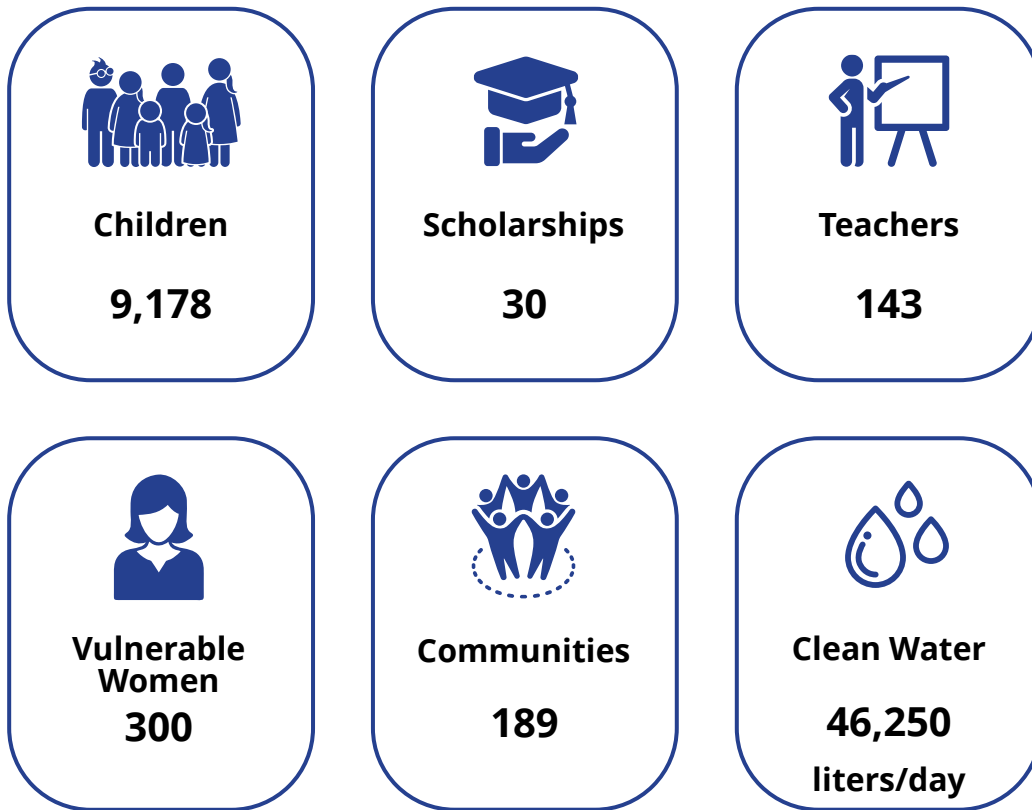


Project Funding Allocation in 2022-2024



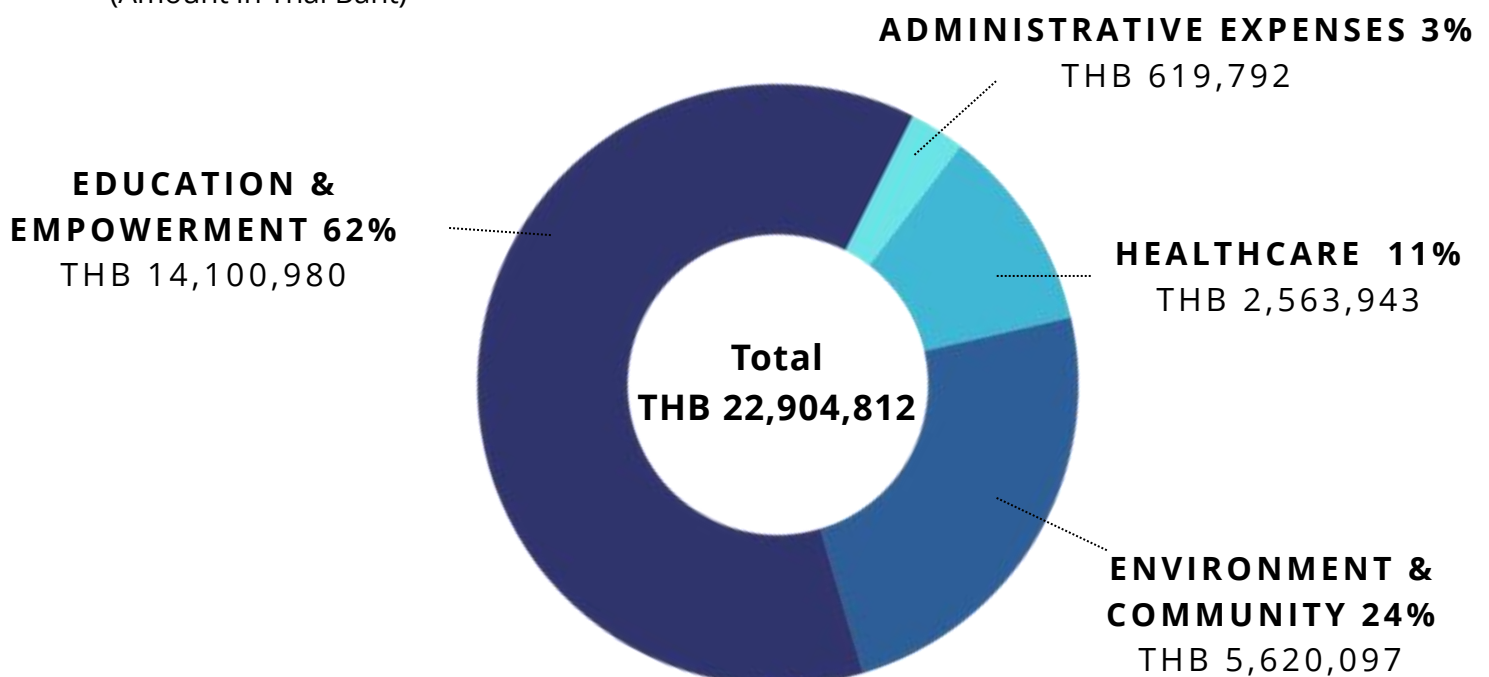

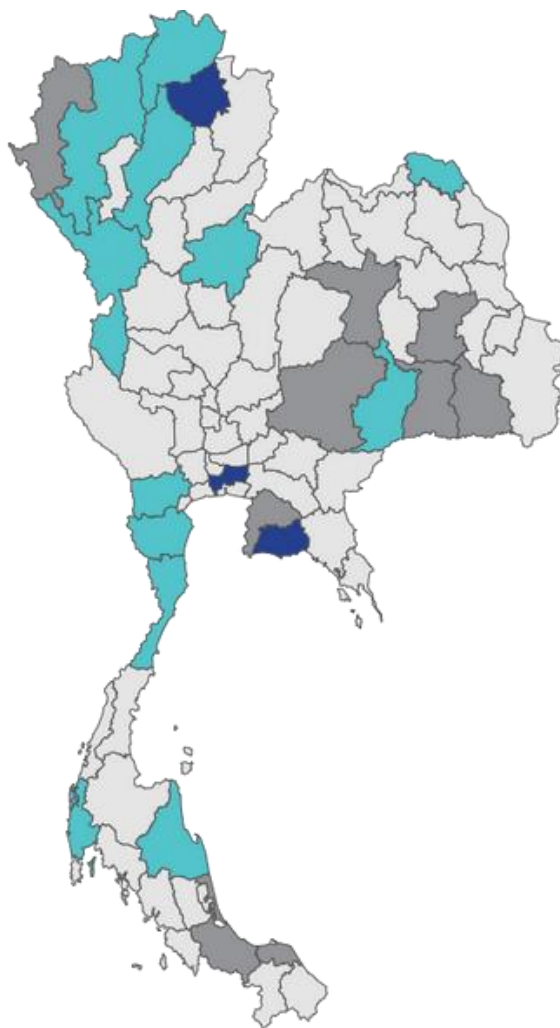

Goal: Supporting the establishment of the Center for Clean Energy to drive India's clean energy transition through education, research, and innovation.

Advancing Clean Energy Innovation

Plaksha University in Mohali, Punjab, India, is a leader in interdisciplinary and advanced technology education. With support from the IVL Foundation through the Reimagining Higher Education Foundation, the university launched the Center for Clean Energy on February 17, 2024. The center focuses on accelerating India's shift to sustainable energy by fostering innovation, research, and education in clean energy technologies.

The Center focuses on policy collaboration, urban climate innovation, and sustainable building design—working with government stakeholders to shape policies, using simulations to improve urban climate conditions, and developing tools to enhance building efficiency.

Current Research Focus

- **Building Energy Efficiency:** Developing solutions for smart urban planning, energy-efficient building envelopes, renewable energy integration, and automation to reduce carbon footprints in India's rapidly growing construction sector.
- **Urban Heat Island (UHI) Mitigation:** Using simulations and microclimate studies to analyze UHI effects, with a focus on cooling strategies like reflective surfaces, vertical gardens, and passive design to reduce urban temperatures and energy consumption.



Empowering Underprivileged Children

Grant Amount: THB 2,221,000

Period: 1 year

Location: Bangkok, Thailand

Beneficiaries: 101 children

Goal: Empowering underprivileged children through education, life skills, and vocational training for a sustainable future.

Breaking Barriers Through Learning

Since 2019, the IVL Foundation has been a dedicated partner of the Good Shepherd Home Foundation, supporting its mission to provide education for underprivileged children. Each year, the IVL Foundation has continued its support, ensuring children aged 4-18 develop proficiency in Thai, along with English, math, and culture—equipping them with essential skills for life. The program also includes activities that nurture emotional intelligence, physical well-being, and adaptability, fostering holistic development.



Beyond academics, the IVL Foundation has consistently supported vocational training, including computer and beautician courses, empowering students with practical skills for future employment. In 2024, the program operated seamlessly, emphasizing key skill development in communication, social and emotional learning, motor skills, and resilience. This year, 101 children benefited from the initiative, gaining the tools and confidence needed to build a better future.



IVL Innovation and STEM Clubs



Grant Amount: THB 716,480
(USD 20,000)

Period: 8 months

Location: Tema, Ghana

Beneficiaries: 2,700 students, 60 teachers from 15 schools and eight Ghana Education Service officers

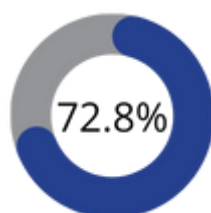
Goal: Providing students with hands-on science experiences to foster an innovative mindset and equip them with essential skills for future technological advancements through the Science Set.

Since 2020, the IVL Foundation, in partnership with Dext Technology Limited, has provided hands-on STEM education through the IVL Innovation and STEM Clubs in 10 underfunded schools in Ghana. This initiative fosters creativity, nurtures scientific curiosity, and equips students with essential 21st-century skills.

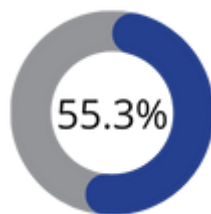
In 2024, the program expanded to five additional schools while continuing to support the original 10. Participating schools receive Dext Science Sets and materials for club activities covering electricity, energy, physics, and human biology.

The program has significantly enhanced student engagement, critical thinking, and practical skills. It has also transformed teaching strategies, encouraging teachers to integrate more hands-on activities, resulting in greater student enthusiasm.

IVL Foundation Scholarships

Empowering Futures Through Education

Grant Amount: THB 1,218,000

Beneficiaries: 30 scholarship recipients

In 2024, the IVL Foundation continued its commitment to expanding educational opportunities for students in Thailand through partnerships and direct scholarships. Our support spans various academic disciplines and education levels, empowering students to pursue their aspirations despite financial challenges.



01. Petroleum and Petrochemical College, Chulalongkorn University

Supported two master's degree students in Polymer Science.

02. Asian Institute of Technology

Sponsored one master's degree student in Environment, Resources, and Development.

03. Soroptimist International Bangkok

Supported three undergraduate students in Nursing at Boromarajonani College of Nursing, Payao.

04. Little Birds Youth Network Foundation

Provided scholarships to 23 students from kindergarten to undergraduate and vocational levels across various disciplines.

Additionally, due to a sudden strain on her family's financial income, provided an **Emergency Support Fund** for two months to assist with transportation and daily expenses, ensuring she could continue her studies without disruption.

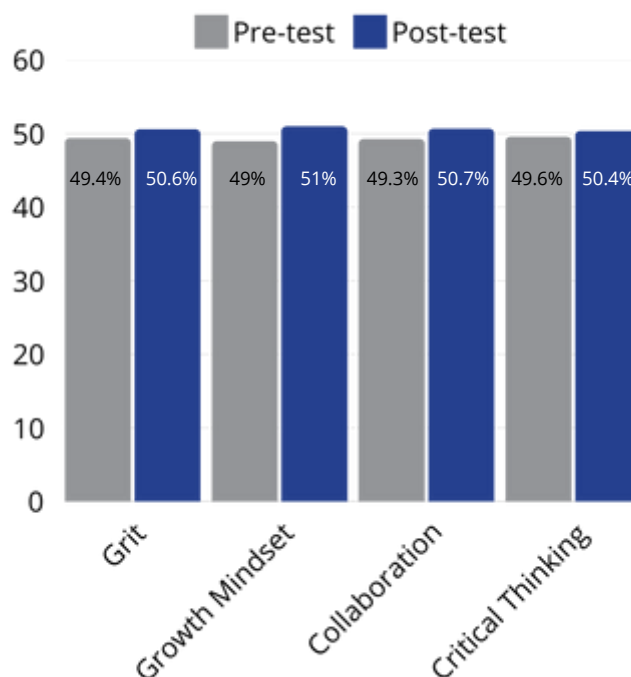

In its fourth year of support, the IVL Foundation has shifted its focus to directly funding the salaries of five teaching fellows—two in Chiang Mai and three in Rayong—who teach mathematics and science. Additionally, the IVL Foundation funded a two-month training program for new fellows, preparing them for their teaching roles from 2024 to 2026.

By the end of the academic year, students taught by fellows supported by the IVL Foundation showed remarkable progress in both academic performance and character development, highlighting the impact of the fellows' effective teaching methods.

World Vision Foundation of Thailand

WASH (Water, Sanitation and Hygiene) Project

Grant Amount: THB 1,575,400

Period: 7 months

Location: Bueng Kan, Buriram, Chiang Mai, Lampang, Nakhon Si Thammarat, Phang Nga, Phitsanulok and Tak, Thailand

Beneficiaries: 1,603 students and 8,115 adults

Goal: Providing safe drinking water in participating schools, reducing waterborne diseases, and sustaining long-term health and well-being in the community.



Since 2020, the IVL Foundation has partnered with the World Vision Foundation of Thailand (WVFT) to address water scarcity and contamination in underserved communities. Initially focused on northern, northeastern, and central Thailand, the initiative expanded to southern Thailand in 2024.



The IVL Foundation continued its support for the WASH (Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene) Project, enhancing access to clean drinking water in 10 schools across eight provinces. The project involved installing and upgrading water filtration systems, ensuring safe and reliable water sources for students and their communities.

Each new water filtration system can generate a minimum of 800 liters of clean drinking water daily, meeting the need of the children, school personnel and people in the surrounding communities.

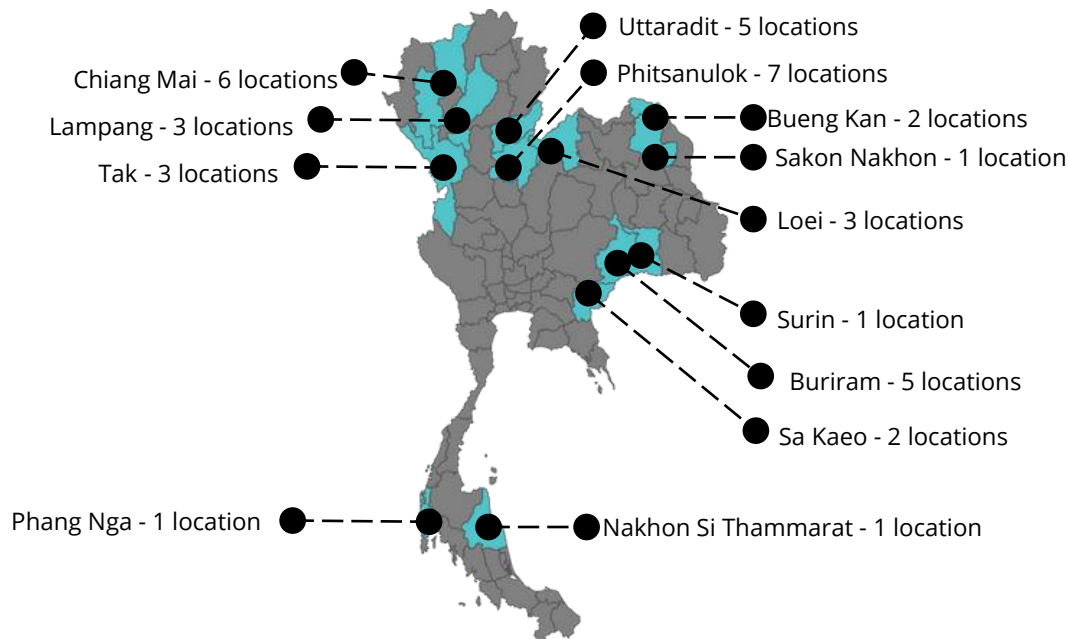

Food Rescue Operation in Hua Hin

Grant Amount: THB 1,500,000

Period: 1 year

Location: Phetchaburi, Prachuap Khiri Khan and Ratchaburi, Thailand

Beneficiaries: 306 beneficiary groups, supporting 480,000 underprivileged people

Goal: Conducting food rescue operations to address food insecurity and deliver nutritious meals to those in need.



The IVL Foundation has provided continuous support for the fourth consecutive year, enabling the expansion of Scholars of Sustenance (SOS) Hua Hin's food rescue operations. What began as a community-focused initiative in Hua Hin has since grown to serve additional districts in Prachuap Khiri Khan, where the SOS Hua Hin office is based. With the support of SOS networks, the program has further expanded to underserved communities in Phetchaburi and, most recently in 2024, Ratchaburi. By rescuing surplus food that would have otherwise gone to waste, the program not only alleviated hunger but also contributed to reducing food waste and promoting sustainability.

Food Rescue Operation

SOS Hua Hin operated year-round, collecting and distributing surplus food daily from a diverse network of donors—including hotels, retailers, manufacturers, restaurants, and farms. With uninterrupted operations, the program ensured that nutritious meals reached vulnerable populations, including underserved communities, hospitals, schools, orphanages, elder care facilities, disability care centers and shelters.

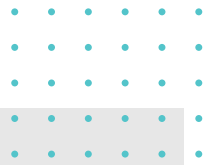


Raising Awareness on Food Insecurity

SOS Hua Hin collaborated with local networks to organize impactful initiatives, including a healthy school meal program, an art auction fundraiser, food drives, and World Food Month. These activities not only provided direct support to those in need but also raised awareness about food waste, surplus redistribution, and how communities can take action to combat hunger.



Rural Development Project



Grant Amount: THB 731,378.90

Period: 1 year

Location: Prachuap Khiri Khan, Thailand

Beneficiaries: 211 students and 23 teachers in three schools

Goal: Creating a better learning environment, equip students with knowledge, and enhance their overall well-being in schools across the Bueng Nakhon subdistrict, Hua Hin, Prachuap Khiri Khan.

Building on last year's efforts, the IVL Foundation remains committed to supporting Bannurnpayom School and its sub-branch in Bueng Nakhon, Hua Hin, through the Rural Development Project. This initiative enhanced education and promotes student development through workshops and activities for all grade levels.

In 2024, the IVL Foundation implemented the Satellite Consolidation Strategy (SCS) within the project, streamlining efforts by integrating knowledge and expanding activities within existing initiatives.

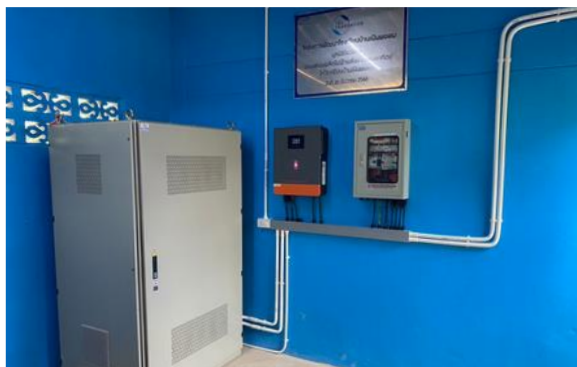


Growing Our Commitment: Bringing Safe and Sustainable Spaces to More Students

Beyond Bannurnpayom School, the IVL Foundation extended its support to Ban Ta Mai Lai Children Development Center by renovating its termite-damaged canteen to address urgent safety concerns. Additionally, the IVL Foundation donated a new battery for the school's solar cell system, ensuring a stable power supply and reinforcing its commitment to improving school facilities.



IMPROVING THE SCHOOLS' INFRASTRUCTURE



Constructed a Storage Room for Solar Cell Batteries

After installing a new solar cell system at Bannurnpayom School in 2023, the IVL Foundation took further steps in 2024 by constructing a separate storage room and relocating the system and its battery. These improvements created a safer environment for students and protected the system from potential damage.



Renovated the Computer Room and Toilets

The school's computer room and toilets had cracked walls, unusable fixtures, and poor sanitation. The IVL Foundation supported their renovation to create a safer, more hygienic, and conducive learning environment for students.



Installed Electric Fans

With scorching summer heat and broken fans in classrooms and the canteen, the IVL Foundation provided new electric fans and replaced faulty ones, ensuring a cooler and more comfortable space for students and staff.



Renovated the Sports Court

The sports court was heavily used by students during their free time, leading to faded paint, cracked cement, and a deteriorated basketball backboard. The IVL Foundation supported its renovation by repainting the court in vibrant colors and installing a new backboard to enhance its quality and durability.



Set Up a Solar Cell System in the Library

The library at Bannurnpayom School, Bueng Nakhon Branch, had remained unused for years due to a faulty electrical system. To restore its functionality, the IVL Foundation installed a dedicated solar cell system, allowing teachers and students to access the space for reading and multimedia learning.





Improved the school's walkway

The muddy walkway during the rainy season posed safety risks for young students and made classrooms difficult to keep clean. The IVL Foundation improved the walkway in front of the classrooms and library, creating a safer and cleaner path for students.



Renovated the canteen

The IVL Foundation supported the renovation of a termite-damaged canteen at Ban Ta Mai Lai Children Development Center, addressing urgent safety concerns identified through its partnership with the Bueng Nakhon Subdistrict Administration Organization. The renovated canteen now provides a safe space for 52 children to eat and play.



Replaced the old solar system batteries

The IVL Foundation addressed the unstable electricity at Ban Ta Mai Lai Children Development Center by donating a new battery for the school's solar cell system. This upgrade now ensures a reliable power supply for both the canteen and classrooms.

ENHANCING LEARNING SPACES WITH BOOKS AND ESSENTIAL RESOURCES

The IVL Foundation donated books, educational materials, tables, and chairs to the schools, enhancing library use and creating a more comfortable learning environment. By year-end, more students were actively reading and engaging with their peers through donated educational games.



PROVIDING EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Mushroom Cultivation and Hydroponic Farming Workshop

The IVL Foundation invited students from Kaenthong Uppatham School, Bangkok, to lead hands-on workshops on mushroom cultivation and hydroponic farming for students at Bannurnpayom School.

Benefit: Equipped students with practical agricultural skills, fostered self-sufficiency, and created income-generating opportunities.



Recreation Day and Library Opening

Hosted a recreational day at Bueng Nakhon Branch to celebrate the newly renovated library, now enriched with an expanded collection of books, and multimedia tools. The event featured an animation screening for cultural insights and interactive games fostering teamwork, and critical thinking.

Benefit: Enhanced students' learning experience, nurtured creativity, and instilled a sense of responsibility.



Reproductive Health Education Workshop

The IVL Foundation conducted a Reproductive Health Education workshop for students in Grades 5 to 9, covering topics such as sexual and reproductive health, healthy relationships, consent, and sexually transmitted diseases.

Benefit: Empowered students to make informed decisions and communicate effectively in a supportive environment.



Creative Design Competitions

• Craft Competition Using Mouse Pads

Students worked in teams to repurpose unused mouse pads into creative items like vases and bags, promoting teamwork and sustainability.

• Sports Shirt Design Competition

Students showcased their creativity by designing sports shirts that best represented their school. The winning design was produced and donated by the IVL Foundation to all students.



Career Quest Youth Camp

As the year concluded, the IVL Foundation organized a youth camp at Bannurnpayom School and its Bueng Nakhon branch, bringing together 20 volunteers to inspire 121 students by introducing them to diverse career paths. A survey revealed that most students aspired to government or agriculture-related jobs, reflecting the influence of their communities. To broaden their perspectives, volunteers role-played careers such as manufacturing engineer, judge, data analyst, HR officer, R&D officer, and interpreter. The camp featured interactive games and activities spanning engineering, science, coding, analytics, math, language, and athletics—fostering skill development in an engaging and inclusive environment.

Engineering

Students were introduced to careers in Civil Engineering, Environmental Engineering, and Manufacturing Engineering. Many expressed enthusiasm for these fields, highlighting their interest in problem-solving, innovation, and the ability to create and improve infrastructure.



Data & Analytics

Students explored career paths in Law, Judiciary, Database Administration, and Human Resources—fields that require strong analytical skills. Many showed interest in these professions, drawn by the potential for high earnings and stimulating challenges.



Language & Communication

Students gained insight into careers such as Interpreter, Diplomat and Guest Relations, all requiring strong language proficiency. Many expressed excitement about mastering new languages, recognizing it as a path to global communication and opportunities abroad.





Water for Girls

Grant Amount: THB 625,610

Period: 7 months

Location: Ratchaburi, Thailand

Beneficiaries: 1,030 students and 50 teachers

Goal: Installing a backup water tank system to ensure a continuous water supply for the students.

Dhammajarinnee Witthaya School, a free boarding school for girls, faced ongoing water shortages that disrupted students' daily routines and hygiene. With an unreliable government water supply, the IVL Foundation supported the construction of backup concrete water tanks and a new pump system. This initiative provided a stable water source, preventing further disruptions and promoting a healthier learning environment for students.



Sook Asok Project

Grant Amount: THB 500,000

Period: 1 year

Location: Bangkok, Thailand

Goal: Enhancing the quality of life in the Asok area.

The Sook Asok Project unites the government, industry partners, and local communities to transform Bangkok's Asok area into a vibrant district by improving traffic flow, enhancing pedestrian spaces, promoting public life, and fostering a thriving community. The IVL Foundation supported this initiative to enhance residents' quality of life.



Renovation of Metropolitan Police Division 5 Facilities

Grant Amount: THB 350,000

Period: 3 months

Location: Bangkok, Thailand

Goal: Improving the facilities for police officers and staff.

The IVL Foundation supported the renovation of the canteen at the Metropolitan Police Division 5, enhancing a communal space for officers and staff. This improvement provided a more comfortable and functional environment for those committed to ensuring public safety and well-being.



School Agriculture Experiments

Grant Amount: THB 116,356

Period: 1 year

Location: Bangkok, Thailand

Beneficiaries: 602 students

Goal: Empowering students from underprivileged backgrounds with practical science education.

In 2024, the IVL Foundation continued supporting science experiment activities, particularly in agriculture, at Kaenthong Uppatham School, a Bangkok Metropolitan Administration (BMA) school in Prawet District. This initiative enhanced science education for economically disadvantaged students, inspiring them to apply scientific knowledge in their future careers and pursue higher education in STEM fields.

With a strong focus on hands-on learning, the program equipped students with practical skills they could implement and develop for potential income-generating activities in the future.



Vegetable Farming & Earthworm Farming

The school received support to enhance greenhouse vegetable growth while successfully experimenting with hydroponic farming. To maximize food waste utilization, students engaged in composting to improve soil quality and expanded their efforts by constructing a dedicated shelter for earthworm farming. Additionally, they developed "Vertical Plant Stands" using donated yam jars equipped with an irrigation system, promoting innovative and sustainable agricultural practices.

Frog Farming

This profitable school project faced odor issues, prompting the IVL Foundation to donate a water treatment system that successfully resolved the problem. Additionally, the IVL Foundation provided 6,000 young frogs, food, and medicine, enhancing productivity while ensuring sustainable and neighbor-friendly operations.

Agriculture Skills Development Camp

The IVL Foundation supported a two-day camp at the Vet Army School in Nakhon Nayok, equipping 116 grade 11 and 12 students with practical agricultural skills. The program covered New Theory Agriculture, livestock farming, indoor gardening, fisheries, and organic product creation. Students found the hands-on experience highly engaging, deepening their interest in agriculture.





Rice Donation Program

Grant Amount: THB 111,352

Period: 1 year

Location: Bangkok, Thailand

Beneficiaries: 500 students

Goal: Providing monthly rice sponsorship for the school lunch program.

Since 2020, the IVL Foundation has supported the Duang Prateep Foundation's lunch program by donating 310 kg of rice monthly to its kindergarten and four children's centers. This assistance helps offset rising rice costs, allowing the centers to allocate more of their budget toward nutritious side dishes.



Community & Culture

Grant Amount: THB 85,000

Location: Bangkok, Thailand

Goal: Promoting cultural diversity and fostering community unity.

The IVL Foundation supported two cultural events promoting diversity: the Rass Garba Dance event celebrated tradition, while the Rizza Dance Academy's Annual Show showcased local talent, fostering cultural awareness and unity.



Northern Flood Emergency Response

Grant Amount: THB 25,000

Location: Northern Thailand

Goal: Providing emergency relief and supporting flood-affected communities.

In September 2024, the World Vision Foundation of Thailand launched an emergency relief effort to aid families impacted by severe flooding in Chiang Mai, Chiang Rai, Mae Hong Son, Nan, Phrae and Tak. The initiative provided critical support, including emergency shelters, relief kits, and home restoration assistance. The IVL Foundation contributed to this lifesaving effort, helping affected communities recover and rebuild their lives.

Operation Smile Thailand

Grant Amount in 2024: THB 2,000,000

Period: 5 years (2024-2028)

Location: Chiang Mai, Chiang Rai, Chonburi, Khon Kaen, Mae Hong Son, Nakhon Ratchasima, Nakhon Si Thammarat, Pattani, Phayao, Roi Et, Songkhla, Sisaket, Surin, Tak, Thailand

Beneficiaries: 839 patients

Goal: Providing free surgeries for underprivileged children to correct facial deformities such as cleft lip, cleft palate, syndactyly, polydactyly, burn scars, and contractures.



Bringing Smiles, Changing Lives

Since 2019, the IVL Foundation has partnered with Operation Smile Thailand (OST) to provide healthcare support for underprivileged communities. In 2024, the IVL Foundation continued this collaboration, supporting comprehensive cleft care for children and parents, along with treatment for burn scars, wounds, and contractures.

OST provided medical treatment to patients with cleft lip, cleft palate, syndactyly, polydactyly, burn scars, wounds, and contractures through Weeklong, Ongoing, and Individual Medical Missions. Additionally, 2,278 medical and non-medical volunteers, including students, joined training sessions on life support, biomedical practices, cleft prevention, and workshops focused on Burn & Wound Management and Craniofacial care.



Pattani Weeklong Medical Mission

From May 12 to 14, 2024, OST held its first medical mission in Pattani, where top specialists from Bangkok provided free surgeries for underprivileged children with cleft conditions. Forty-seven patients were deemed healthy for surgery.



Central Women's Correctional Institution in Bangkok

Correctional Facility Support



Grant Amount: THB 281,980

Location: Bangkok, Thailand

Beneficiaries: At least 300 inmates

Goal: Supporting medical equipment aimed at improving healthcare and living conditions for female inmates at Central Women's Correctional Institution.

Female inmates at the Central Women's Correctional Institution in Bangkok face significant challenges due to limited access to essential healthcare facilities, with a shortage of critical medical equipment such as Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs), hospital beds, wheelchairs, stretchers, and walkers. These gaps not only affect the quality of care but also compromise the well-being of inmates, particularly those with mobility issues or chronic health conditions.

Recognizing these urgent needs, the IVL Foundation conducted an assessment and, on December 26, 2024, donated vital medical equipment to enhance healthcare services within the institution. This initiative reflected the Foundation's commitment to supporting marginalized communities. By improving healthcare access, the IVL Foundation aimed to foster both the physical and mental well-being of female inmates, contributing to their rehabilitation and quality of life.

Life Support Training

The IVL Foundation organized Life Support and AED Training for correctional officers and female inmates at the Central Women's Correctional Institution. The sessions equipped participants with vital emergency response skills, enhancing the institution's healthcare capacity and emergency preparedness.



Osteopathy Camp

Grant Amount: THB 256,963

Period: 3 days

Location: Bangkok, Thailand

Beneficiaries: 310 people

Goal: Providing free osteopathic care for underserved individuals to support their rehabilitation.

From May 24–26, 2024, the IVL Foundation supported the Osteopathy Camp at the Prem Yoga and Ayurveda Center in Bangkok. This three-day event provided free osteopathic treatment and healthcare services to individuals with limited access to medical care. With a focus on alleviating chronic ailments, the camp treated 310 participants, promoting their rehabilitation and enhancing overall well-being.



Pink Ribbon Scramble

Grant Amount: THB 25,000

Location: Bangkok, Thailand

Goal: Supporting the Pink Ribbon Scramble 2024 event to raise fund for the Queen Sirikit Centre for Breast Cancer Foundation.

The IVL Foundation supported the Pink Ribbon Scramble 2024, held on October 5 at Pineapple Valley Golf Club in Hua Hin. This fundraising event aimed to promote breast cancer awareness and generate support for critical research and treatment programs. Proceeds were directed to the Queen Sirikit Centre for Breast Cancer Foundation, helping provide care for underprivileged patients and advance life-saving initiatives.
