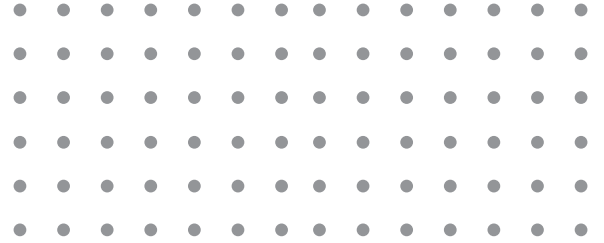

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# Message from the Chairperson

Dear Friends,

The IVL Foundation is so proud to have lent a helping hand to almost 26,000 children in 2025, an amazing increase from over 9,000 in 2024. We also provided assistance to almost 237,000 vulnerable adults, up from 300 in 2024. Unsurprisingly, 75% of our financial assistance was allocated to education and empowerment activities while 14% went to environment and community activities, and 9% to healthcare.

**Projects like Operation Smile Thailand, rewarded us with beautiful smiles on the faces of children with facial deformities such as cleft lip, cleft palate, syndactyly, polydactyly, burn scars, and contractures.**

Our largest venture, the Rural Development Project in Prachuap Khiri Khan Province, assisted 217 students who have benefited from workshops we provided in hydroponics and financial literacy for instance. We were also pleased to help build a female-only dormitory near Mae Hong Son for girls who lived too far from school. IVLF scholarships enable students to continue their education, such as nursing and STEM studies. Donations have gone to Thailand's largest correctional facility, Klong Prem, that extended healthcare access to over 7,000 inmates, as well as assistance to flood victims in the South.

While most projects are in Thailand, we do have projects in India, Ghana and Namibia. Projects like Operation Thailand Smile, have rewarded us with beautiful smiles on the faces of children with facial deformities such as cleft lips and cleft palates. The project has been so successful, we donated to a similar project in Namibia, Africa, called Nampharm Foundation, which has also performed similar operations on children. In Ghana, we have had a STEM project called Dext, since 2021 in 20 schools that affects 3,600 students. It is so popular that even the President of Ghana has shown interest.

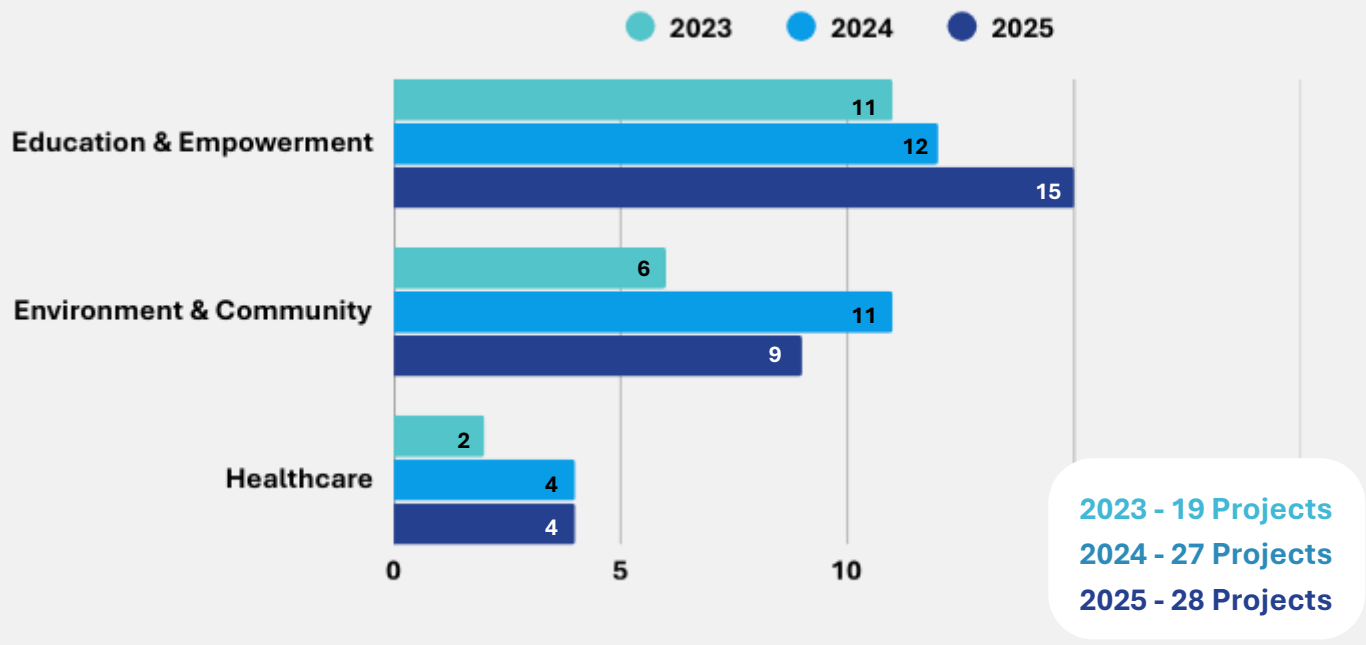


# The Year in Review

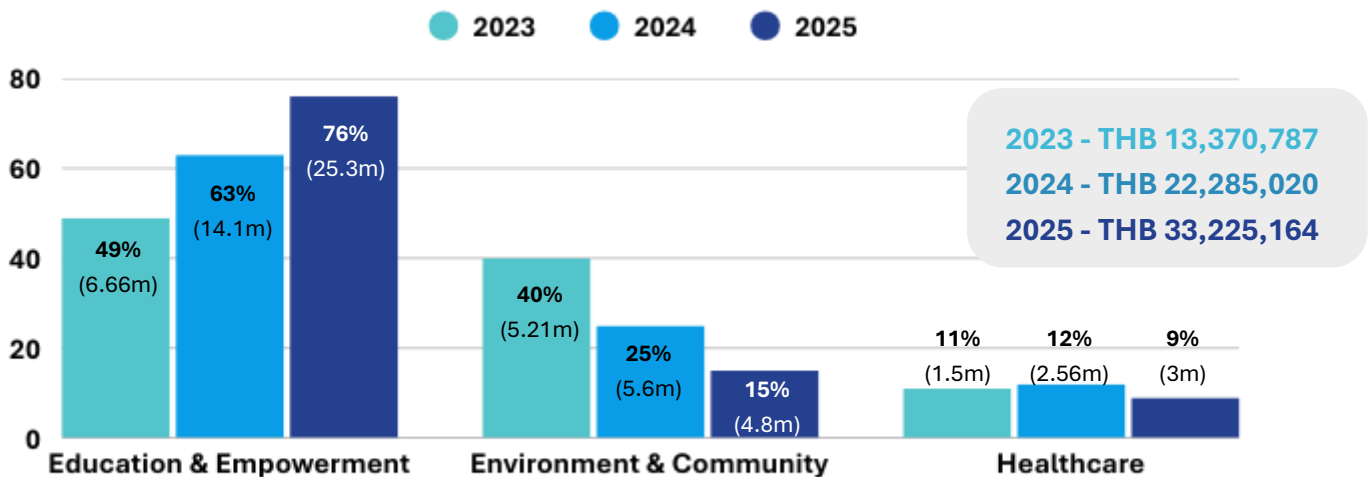

## Number of Projects in 2023-2025

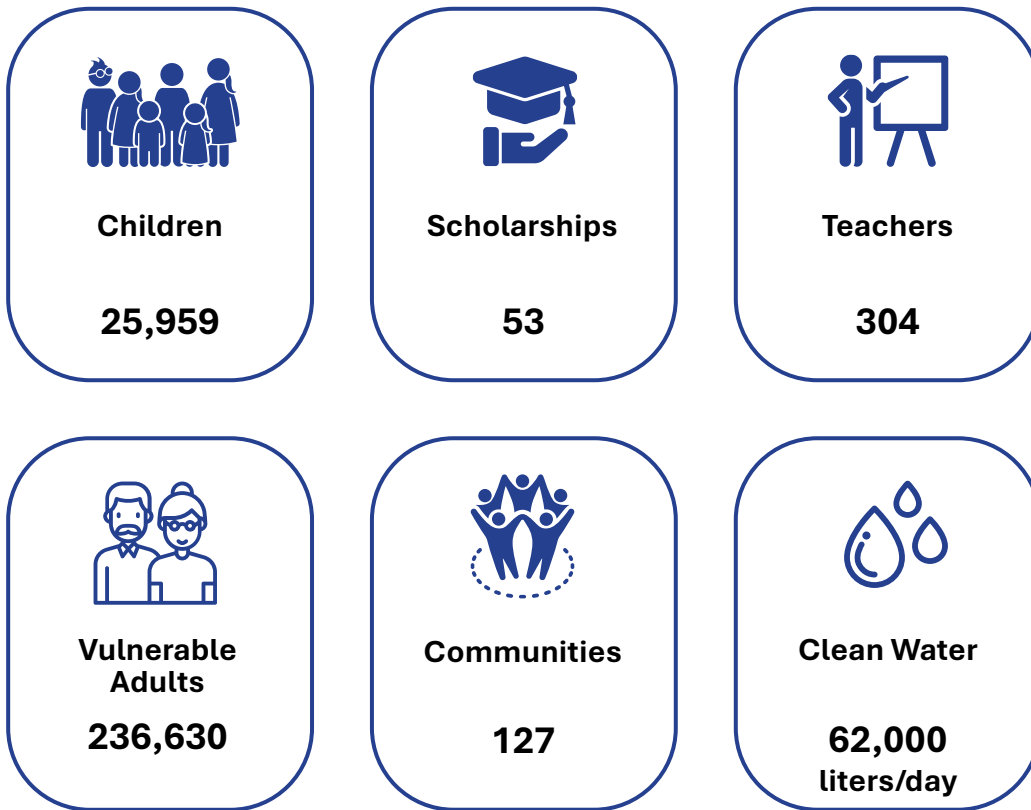


## Project Funding Allocation in 2023-2025



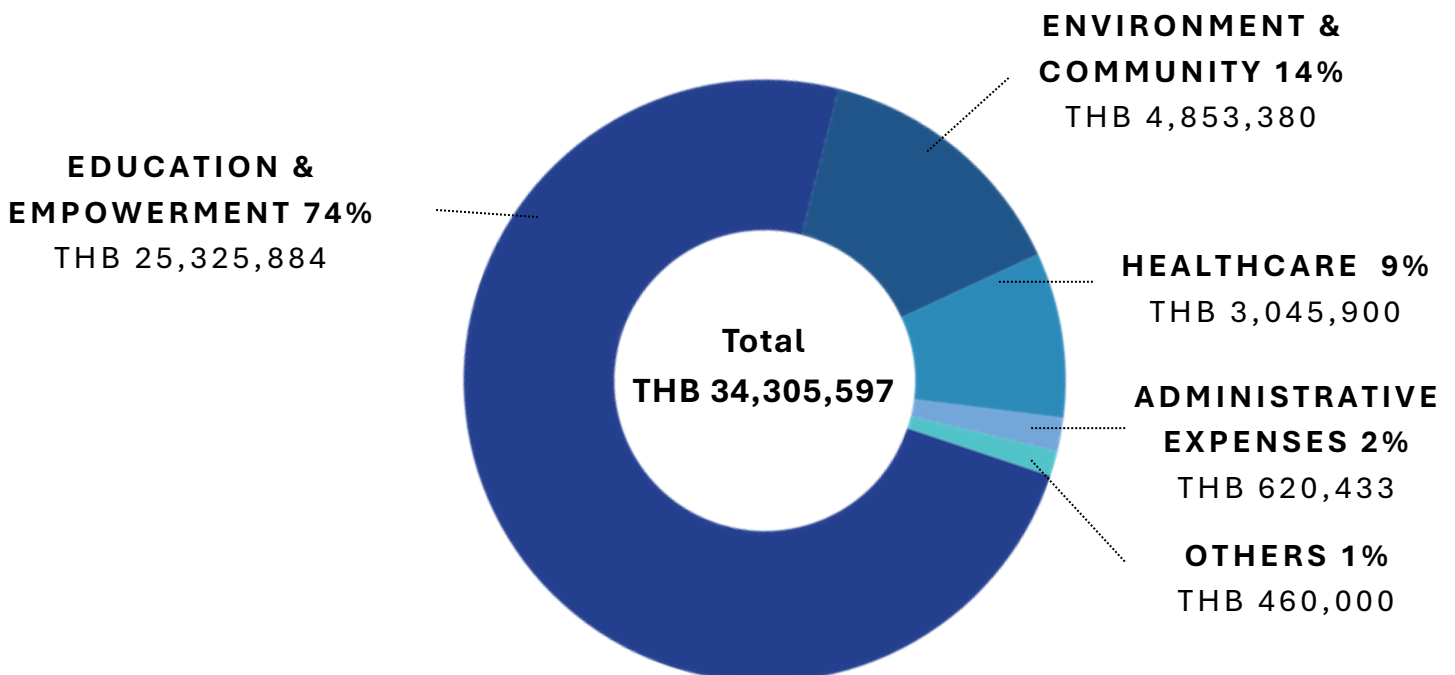

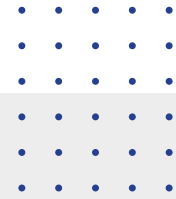

# Reimagining Higher Education Foundation Support the Center for Clean Energy at Plaksha University



**Grant Amount:** THB 15,123,162  
(INR 40,000,000)

**Location:** Punjab, India

**Goal:** Supporting the establishment of the Center for Clean Energy to drive India's clean energy transition through education, research, and innovation.

Plaksha University is a leader in interdisciplinary and advanced technology education. With support from the IVL Foundation through the Reimagining Higher Education Foundation, the university launched the Center for Clean Energy in 2024. The center focuses on advancing India's transition to clean energy through education and applied research.

In 2025, the Center reached key milestones, including the commissioning of the Thermal Energy Storage Living Lab and progress across four priority research areas—Urban Microclimate, Decarbonizing Residential Cooling, Smart Buildings, and Smart Microgrids. These efforts generated tangible outcomes such as publications, policy insights, tools, and training programs, strengthening impact across India's clean energy ecosystem.



# Good Shepherd Home Foundation Empowering Underprivileged Children

**Grant Amount:** THB 2,176,400

**Location:** Bangkok, Thailand

**Beneficiaries:** 104 children

**Goal:** Empowering underprivileged children through education, life skills, and vocational training for a sustainable future.

## Inspiring Possibility through Education

Since 2019, the IVL Foundation has partnered with the Good Shepherd Home Foundation to expand access to quality education for underprivileged children. Through sustained annual support, the program serves children aged 4–18, strengthening proficiency in Thai, alongside English, mathematics, and cultural learning. Complemented by activities that build emotional intelligence, physical well-being, and adaptability, the initiative supports holistic development and equips children with essential skills for life.



In 2025, the program was delivered through both onsite and offsite formats to ensure continuity of learning despite periods of disruption. Expanded basic computer classes were introduced for younger students, equipping them with essential 21st-century skills.

In total, 104 children benefited from the initiative, gaining the knowledge, confidence, and tools needed to build a better future.



# IVLF Scholars Program and Other Scholarships



## Transforming Lives Through Learning

**Grant Amount:** THB 1,550,148

**Beneficiaries:** 53 scholarship recipients

In 2025, the IVL Foundation strengthened its commitment to expanding educational opportunities for students studying in Thailand. Through targeted scholarships and strategic partnerships, we supported learners across diverse disciplines and education levels, empowering them to pursue their ambitions despite financial challenges.

## 01. IVLF Scholars Program

Funded tuition for two bachelor's students in Medical Emergency Operations at Navamindradhiraj University, and supported one student to pursue a high school-level Science and Math program at Triam Udom Suksa Pattanakarn Pranburi School.



## 02. Asian Institute of Technology

Sponsored three master's students in the school of Environment, Resources, and Development and the School of Engineering and Technology, with one student successfully graduating in August 2025.

## 03. Petroleum and Petrochemical College, Chulalongkorn University

Sponsored four master's students in the Polymer Science and Petrochemical Technology programs, with two recipients successfully graduating in 2025.

## 04. Little Birds Youth Network Foundation

Provided scholarships to 39 students from kindergarten to undergraduate and vocational levels across various disciplines.

## 05. Soroptimist International Bangkok

Supported three undergraduate students in Nursing at Boromarajonani College of Nursing, Payao.

# Building a Dormitory at Ban Huai Kong Po School

**Grant Amount:** THB 550,000

**Location:** Mae Hong Son, Thailand

**Beneficiaries:** 20 students

**Goal:** Supporting the construction of a new female dormitory at Ban Huai Kong Po School to provide safe, adequate accommodation and enhance girls' access to education.



In partnership with iCare Thailand Foundation, the IVL Foundation supported the construction of a new student dormitory at Ban Huai Kong Po School in Mae La Noi District, Mae Hong Son. The school serves 65 students from kindergarten to grade 6, primarily Paganyaw hill tribe children from remote villages separated by two mountains, with the only access being a rugged dirt road often impassable during the rainy season. Many students previously walked up to two hours each way to attend school.

Completed in May, the dormitory now provides safe accommodation for up to 20 students, reducing daily travel and enabling better attendance, improved focus, and greater access to education. This facility represents a meaningful step toward enhancing living and learning conditions for students in this underserved community.

# School Agriculture Experiments



**Grant Amount:** THB 152,514

**Location:** Bangkok, Thailand

**Participating BMA Schools:**

1. Kaenthong Uppatham School
2. Matthayom Suwitserianusorn School

**Beneficiaries:** 2,443 students and 75 teachers

**Goal:** Empowering students from underprivileged backgrounds by strengthening practical science education and upgrading school facilities to support a better learning environment.

In 2025, the IVL Foundation supported hands-on agricultural science activities at Kaen Thong Uppatham School, strengthening science education for economically disadvantaged students and inspiring future STEM pathways. The Foundation also resumed its partnership with Matthayom Suwitserianusorn School through peer-to-peer learning activities and canteen improvements, enhancing the overall learning environment.

## Peer-to-Peer Learning in Sustainable Agriculture

The IVL Foundation held agricultural workshops at two BMA schools in Bangkok, where student mentors led peers from Bannurnpayom School in Hua Hin in hands-on sustainable farming and hydroponics activities, building skills, confidence, and leadership.



## Mother's Day Youth Empowerment & Sustainability

On Mother's Day, the IVL Foundation welcomed seven students from Kaenthong Uppatham School to the Organic Green Market, where they showcased handmade products from their agricultural project, translating classroom learning into real-world entrepreneurship and sustainability.



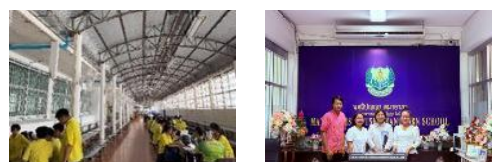
## Youth Camp at Klong Pittaya Longkorn School

In July, the IVL Foundation supported a youth camp for 183 students from Kaenthong Uppatham School at Klong Pittaya Longkorn School, featuring hands-on cultural and environmental activities that strengthened practical skills and sustainability awareness.



## Gutter Renovation for a Safer School Environment

The IVL Foundation supported the renovation of the canteen gutters. Built in 2006, the canteen had suffered severe leaks and flooding, disrupting meals, classes, and activities. The repairs have transformed it into a safe, multi-purpose space for learning and nourishment.



# IVL Innovation and STEM Clubs



**Grant Amount:** THB 533,860 (USD 16,000)

**Location:** Tema, Ghana

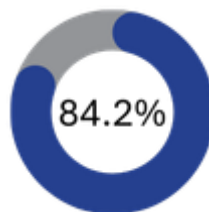
**Beneficiaries:** 3,600 students, 60 teachers from 20 schools

**Goal:** Providing students with hands-on science experiences to foster an innovative mindset and equip them with essential skills for future technological advancements through the Science Set.

Since 2020, the IVL Foundation, in collaboration with Dext Technology Limited, has delivered hands-on STEM learning through the IVL Innovation and STEM Clubs across under-resourced schools in Ghana. The program nurtures creativity, sparks scientific curiosity, and equips students with key 21st-century skills.

In 2025, we expanded the IVL Innovation and STEM Clubs program to 20 schools, reaching more students and providing teacher training to integrate the Dext Science Set into the curriculum. The year culminated in the IVL Exhibition, attended by 500 people, where students presented community projects addressing real issues and showcased innovations such as egg incubators, smart irrigation systems, smart aquatic cleaners, blind canes, hydroelectric devices, and hydraulic excavators.

## Turning Ideas into Action

Holy Child R/C Basic School, winners of last year's competition, designed a touchless smart waste bin from plastic bottles, earning recognition for innovation and sustainability. As part of their award, they upgraded it into a mobile, Bluetooth-controlled system, making waste disposal interactive, fun, and more accessible.



# Navjyoti India Foundation Child Education Project

**Grant Amount:** THB 779,000 (INR 2,000,000)

**Location:** India

**Goal:** Empowering vulnerable children through education, skills, and leadership development to foster holistic growth, improved learning outcomes, and self-reliance.

For 2025–2026, the IVL Foundation supports Navjyoti India Foundation’s Child Education Project, empowering vulnerable children through education, leadership, and skills training. The program strengthens academics, nurtures values and character, and provides career guidance and practical skills, fostering holistic growth, school retention, and self-reliance while preparing students for future opportunities.



## Ekal Vidyalaya Foundation of India 55 Ekal Vidyalayas (One-teacher School)

**Grant Amount:** THB 663,300 (INR 1,650,000)

**Location:** India

**Goal:** Providing accessible basic education and life skills to children in rural and tribal communities while empowering local educators.

The IVL Foundation supports the Ekal Vidyalaya Foundation of India in operating 55 one-teacher schools in rural and tribal communities across India for the 2025–2026 fiscal year. Led primarily by local women, these schools provide non-formal education to children aged 4–14 who have limited access to formal schooling. Operating three hours daily, 22–24 days per month, each school serves approximately 25 students, delivering a practical curriculum that includes basic literacy and numeracy, health and hygiene, local sports, development education, and moral values.





## Babson Connect Worldwide 2025

**Grant Amount:** THB 1,692,500 (USD 50,000)

**Location:** Tuscany, Italy

**Goal:** Improving the facilities for police officers and staff.

The IVL Foundation supported Babson Connect Worldwide (BCW) 2025, held in Tuscany from March 27–29 under the theme “Decoding the Medici: Pioneering the Digital Renaissance.” The event brought together entrepreneurial leaders from around the world to reconnect, share ideas, and celebrate a collective commitment to innovation and impact.



## Dragonfly Summit 2025

**Grant Amount:** THB 1,605,000

**Location:** Bangkok, Thailand

**Goal:** Sponsoring the Dragonfly Summit 2025.

The IVL Foundation supported the Dragonfly Summit 2025, held on 27–28 September 2025 at Siam Paragon, Bangkok, under the theme “Flow.” The summit attracted over 3,000 participants and brought together visionary leaders to inspire and equip individuals with fresh perspectives, practical leadership skills, and meaningful networks to navigate complexity and drive positive social change.



## Teach for Thailand Fellowship Program

**Grant Amount:** THB 500,000

**Location:** 46 schools in Thailand

**Beneficiaries:** 30 teachers and 8,285 student

**Goal:** Providing equitable education in Thailand by placing talented teachers in under-resourced schools for two years.

Teach For Thailand (TFT) is a non-profit working to end educational inequity by placing talented individuals to teach mathematics, science, and English in under-resourced middle schools for two-year fellowships. The program develops fellows’ teaching, leadership, and problem-solving skills, while providing students with an enhanced education. In 2025, the IVL Foundation supported the recruitment and institute training of 30 teaching fellows to serve in economically challenged schools across Thailand.

# World Vision Foundation of Thailand WASH (Water, Sanitation and Hygiene) Project

**Grant Amount:** THB 2,000,000

**Location:** Bueng Kan, Buriram, Chiang Mai, Krabi, Nakhon Phanom, Nakhon Si Thammarat, Phang Nga, Phetchabun, Phitsanulok, Sakaeo and Sakon Nakhon, Thailand

**Beneficiaries:** 3,236 students and 9,071 adults

**Goal:** Providing safe drinking water in participating schools, reducing waterborne diseases, and sustaining long-term health and well-being in the community.



Since 2020, the IVL Foundation has partnered with World Vision Foundation of Thailand (WVFT) to address water scarcity and water quality challenges in underserved communities. Initially implemented in northern, northeastern, and central Thailand, the initiative expanded to southern Thailand in 2024 and continued through 2025.



In 2025, the Foundation sustained its support for the WASH Project by improving access to safe drinking water in 14 schools across 11 provinces through the installation and upgrading of water filtration systems, benefiting students and surrounding communities.

Each new water filtration system produces at least 800 liters of clean drinking water daily, ensuring safe water for children, school staff, and surrounding communities.

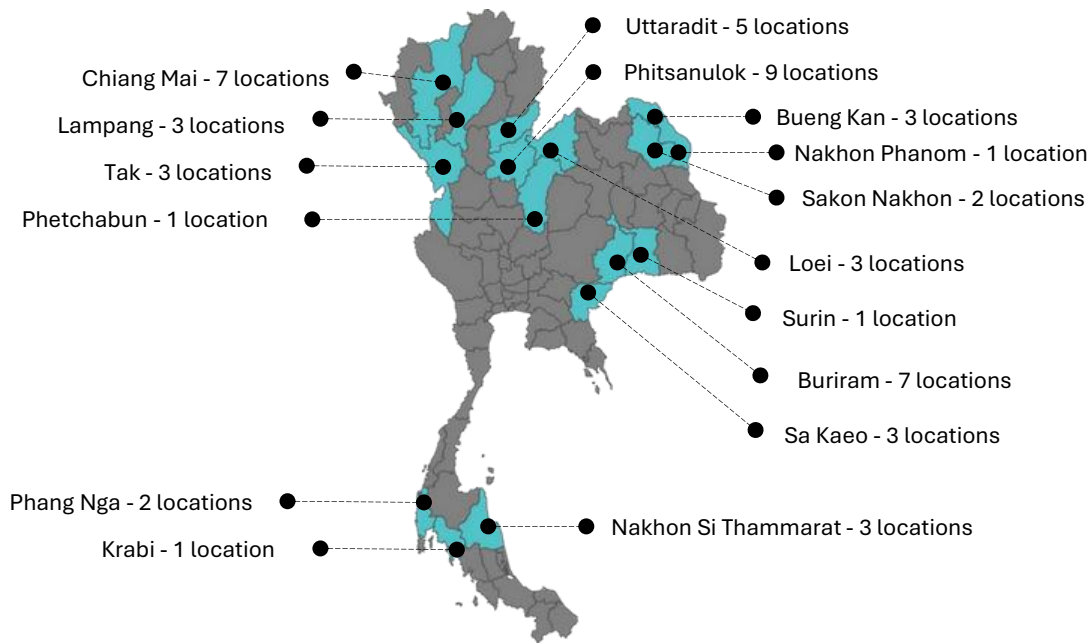

# Scholars of Sustenance Foundation Food Rescue Operation in Hua Hin

**Grant Amount:** THB 1,500,000

**Location:** Khon Kaen, Kanchanaburi, Phetchaburi,  
Prachuap Khiri Khan and Ratchaburi, Thailand

**Beneficiaries:** 151 beneficiary groups, supporting 322,371  
underprivileged people

**Goal:** Conducting food rescue operations to address food  
insecurity and deliver nutritious meals to those in need.



For the fifth consecutive year, the IVL Foundation continued its support for Scholars of Sustenance (SOS) Hua Hin, enabling the continued expansion of its Food Rescue Operations. What began as a community-based initiative in Hua Hin has grown to cover additional districts across Prachuap Khiri Khan, where the SOS Hua Hin office is based, and has further expanded to underserved communities in Phetchaburi. By rescuing surplus food that would otherwise go to waste, the program addresses food insecurity while reducing food loss and promoting long-term sustainability.

## Volunteer-led Food Rescue Initiatives

This year, SOS Hua Hin expanded its operations to additional provinces—Ratchaburi, Kanchanaburi, and Khon Kaen—through the support of strong local volunteer networks. The program established 45 volunteer networks nationwide and further strengthened collaboration with local governments and community organizations to sustain and scale its impact.



## Reducing Farm-Level Food Loss

SOS Hua Hin further expanded the Rescue Farm Program by establishing a network with 14 farms. The program addresses food loss resulting from oversupply and sharply declining market prices, which often make harvesting economically unviable for farmers. By rescuing surplus produce for redistribution, the initiative reduces food waste, raises farmers' awareness of food loss, and promotes more sustainable practices.



# Rural Development Project



**Grant Amount:** THB 425,317

**Location:** Prachuap Khiri Khan, Thailand

**Beneficiaries:** 217 students and 20 teachers in three schools

**Goal:** Creating a better learning environment, equip students with knowledge, and enhance their overall well-being in schools across the Bueng Nakorn subdistrict, Hua Hin, Prachuap Khiri Khan.

For the third consecutive year, the IVL Foundation continues its long-term support for Bannurnpayom School—including its main and sub-branches—and Ban Ta Mai Lai Children Development Center .

In 2025, the Foundation focused on empowering students through training and workshops that foster academic growth, emotional resilience, and hands-on learning beyond the classroom. At the same time, critical infrastructure improvements were made to ensure access to essential facilities that promote hygiene, well-being, and an enhanced learning environment.



## IMPROVED SAFETY AND LEARNING SPACES AT BUENG NAKORN BRANCH

At the Bannurnpayom School, Bueng Nakorn branch, facility upgrades enhanced safety, functionality, and learning conditions. The polished walkway and improved drainage prevent accidents and flooding, while repaired water tanks and refurbished canteen partitions ensure reliable access to essential facilities. Refreshed exterior walls create a welcoming and durable space, fostering student well-being, supporting positive learning experiences, and encouraging greater attendance.

## FACILITY AND HYGIENE UPGRADES AT BAN TA MAI LAI

At Ban Ta Mai Lai Children Development Center, the IVL Foundation enhanced hygiene, learning, and daily living conditions for students. A new solar-powered RO water filtration system replaced the outdated unit, ensuring safe drinking water. Two new toilets and a shower were built after demolishing the old and unusable facilities, providing reliable sanitation. Ten sets of tables and chairs addressed learning equipment shortages, while direct meal support sustained the lunch program amid the center's highest-ever student enrollment, improving health, well-being, and readiness to learn.



## EMPOWERING STUDENTS BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

### Hands-on Learning: Sustainable Farming & Hydroponics Workshop

The Foundation organized a two-day workshop for eight students and two science teachers from Bannurnpayom School. Participants visited two BMA schools where the Foundation has run agricultural projects for six years. The sessions included peer-to-peer learning, with students teaching students and sharing practical knowledge.

**Benefit:** Deepened participants' agricultural knowledge, fostered hands-on learning, and promoted cross-regional collaboration between schools.



### Empowering Students for a Safer Digital Future

In July, the Foundation organized interactive workshops on cyberbullying and online scams, teaching students how to identify online threats, build empathy, and understand basic digital laws. Volunteers also shared their educational journeys to inspire students.

**Benefit:** Equipped students with digital literacy skills, raised awareness of online safety, and motivated them to pursue learning with confidence.



### Think Smart, Spend Smart

In November, the Foundation hosted a financial literacy workshop for 35 students. Through interactive activities, participants explored money management, the gap between spending expectations and Thailand's average income, and the impact of education on long-term earnings.

**Benefit:** Empowered students to make informed financial decisions and plan responsibly for their future.



### Spark Curiosity, Inspire Science

In December, the Foundation organized its first Science Youth Camp at Bannurnpayom School, engaging 157 students in hands-on science learning. Supported by 15 volunteers from Indorama Ventures, the camp featured eight interactive stations, including paper planes, cup phones, bottle rockets, water filtration, and engineering challenges.

**Benefit:** Sparked curiosity, strengthened problem-solving skills, and boosted students' confidence, making scientific concepts enjoyable and relevant to real life.



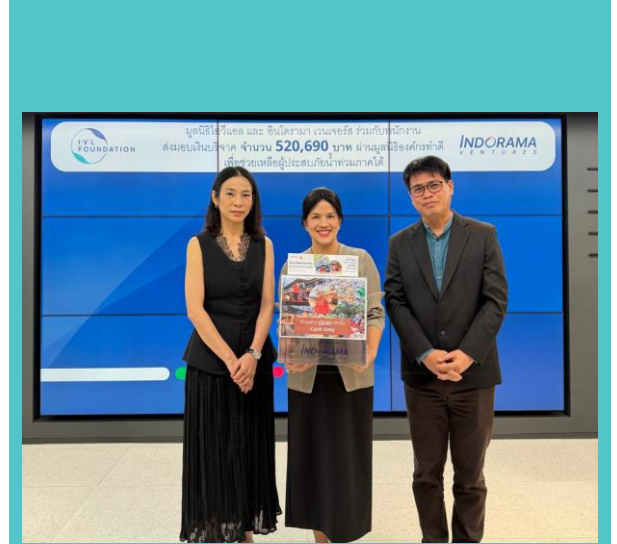
# Southern Thailand Flood Relief Initiative

**Grant Amount:** THB 500,000

**Location:** Southern Thailand

**Goal:** Deliver timely relief and essential support to flood-affected communities in southern Thailand.

In response to severe flooding in southern Thailand, the IVL Foundation and Indorama Ventures, together with employee contributions, donated funds to the Good Organization Foundation by Panadda Wongphudee to support emergency relief efforts. The support enabled the timely delivery of essential supplies and assistance to affected families, helping communities recover more quickly and strengthening resilience during the crisis.



# Chinmaya Mission New York Center

**Grant Amount:** THB 163,125

**Location:** New York, United States

**Goal:** Supporting a community hub that advances education, cultural understanding, and lifelong learning.

The IVL Foundation supported Chinmaya Mission New York (CMNY) in the construction of a new Chinmaya Mission Center, strengthening its capacity to share the wisdom of Vedanta and deliver educational and cultural programs. The new center serves as a dedicated space for learning, spiritual growth, cultural exchange, and community connection.



# Supporting Communities Affected by Cyclone Ditwah

**Grant Amount:** THB 100,000

**Location:** Sri Lanka

**Goal:** Providing essential humanitarian relief and supporting community recovery.

The IVL Foundation supported collective relief and recovery efforts for communities in Sri Lanka affected by Cyclone Ditwah, in collaboration with the Embassy and Permanent Mission of Sri Lanka in Bangkok. The support enabled the provision of essential supplies, medical aid, shelter assistance, and livelihood recovery.





## Rice Donation Program



**Grant Amount:** THB 98,208

**Location:** Bangkok, Thailand

**Beneficiaries:** 500 students

**Goal:** Providing monthly rice sponsorship for the school lunch program.

Since 2020, the IVL Foundation has supported the Duang Prateep Foundation’s lunch program by donating 310 kg of rice monthly to its kindergarten and four children’s centers. This assistance helps offset rising rice costs, allowing the centers to allocate more of their budget toward nutritious side dishes.

The IVL Foundation supported the RECO Collection exhibition at the Netherlands–Thai Chamber of Commerce Gala Dinner, themed “Thai Soft Power x Dutch Innovation: Fueling the Creative Economy.” The exhibition showcased the transformation of undervalued materials into high-value resources, raising awareness of environmental sustainability while celebrating creativity and innovation.

# Operation Smile Thailand

**Grant Amount in 2025:** THB 2,000,000

**Location:** Chiang Mai, Chiang Rai, Chonburi, Khon Kaen, Mae Hong Son, Nakhon Ratchasima, Nakhon Si Thammarat, Pattani, Phayao, Roi Et, Songkhla, Sisaket, Surin, Tak and Yasothorn, Thailand

**Beneficiaries:** 750 patients

**Goal:** Providing free surgeries for underprivileged children to correct facial deformities such as cleft lip, cleft palate, syndactyly, polydactyly, burn scars, and contractures.



## Bringing Smiles, Changing Lives

Since 2019, the IVL Foundation has partnered with Operation Smile Thailand (OST) to provide healthcare support to underprivileged communities across the country. The collaboration enables comprehensive cleft care for children and parents, and extends to treatments for burn scars, wounds, contractures, and other congenital conditions.

In 2025, OST conducted four short-term surgical missions: February in Mae Hong Son, May in Tak, August in Yasothorn, and November in Tak. These missions collectively brought smiles and hope to more than 750 patients, providing life-changing surgeries and treatments for cleft lips and palates, burn scars, fused or extra fingers, and other facial deformities.



### Mae Sot Weeklong Medical Mission

One of OST's largest missions took place from May 23–26 in Mae Sot, Tak Province. Specialized medical professionals—including pediatricians, anesthesiologists, dentists, and plastic surgeons—served 153 families on screening day, with 94 patients cleared for surgery. The IVL Foundation supported the mission by sending seven volunteers as non-medical personnel to manage patient records and coordinate hospital logistics, providing a meaningful opportunity to contribute directly to patient care and community well-being.



# Cryoviva - Support the Stem Cell Transplant Fund

**Grant Amount:** THB 500,000

**Location:** Bangkok, Thailand

**Goal:** Supporting life-saving stem cell and bone marrow treatments for children facing serious health challenges.

The IVL Foundation supported Cryoviva’s fundraising campaign, “Cryoviva – Sending Smiles of Happiness.” The campaign raised funds for the Stem Cell Transplant Program at Siriraj Hospital, providing vital support to children with blood disorders and other life-threatening conditions who depend on stem cell or bone marrow transplants for survival.



# Cleft Care Project

**Grant Amount:** THB 336,500

**Location:** Namibia

**Goal:** Providing access to essential reconstructive care for children with facial deformities.

Nampharm Foundation provides free facial reconstructive surgeries and holistic care for Namibian children with cleft lips, palates, and other facial deformities. In 2025, the IVL Foundation supported two cleft lip surgeries, two cleft palate surgeries, and one orthodontic treatment, restoring function, appearance, and confidence for the children and their families.



# Correctional Facility Support

**Grant Amount:** THB 209,400

**Location:** Bangkok, Thailand

**Goal:** Enhancing emergency response and overall patient care, and supporting equitable healthcare access.

The IVL Foundation donated essential medical equipment to Klong Prem Central Prison, enhancing healthcare services for over 7,000 inmates. The Foundation provided key equipment, including two AEDs, an EKG monitor, an automatic blood pressure device, and two professional digital scales. This support strengthens emergency response capacity, improves overall patient care, and underscores the Foundation’s commitment to dignity and equitable healthcare access for underserved communities.
